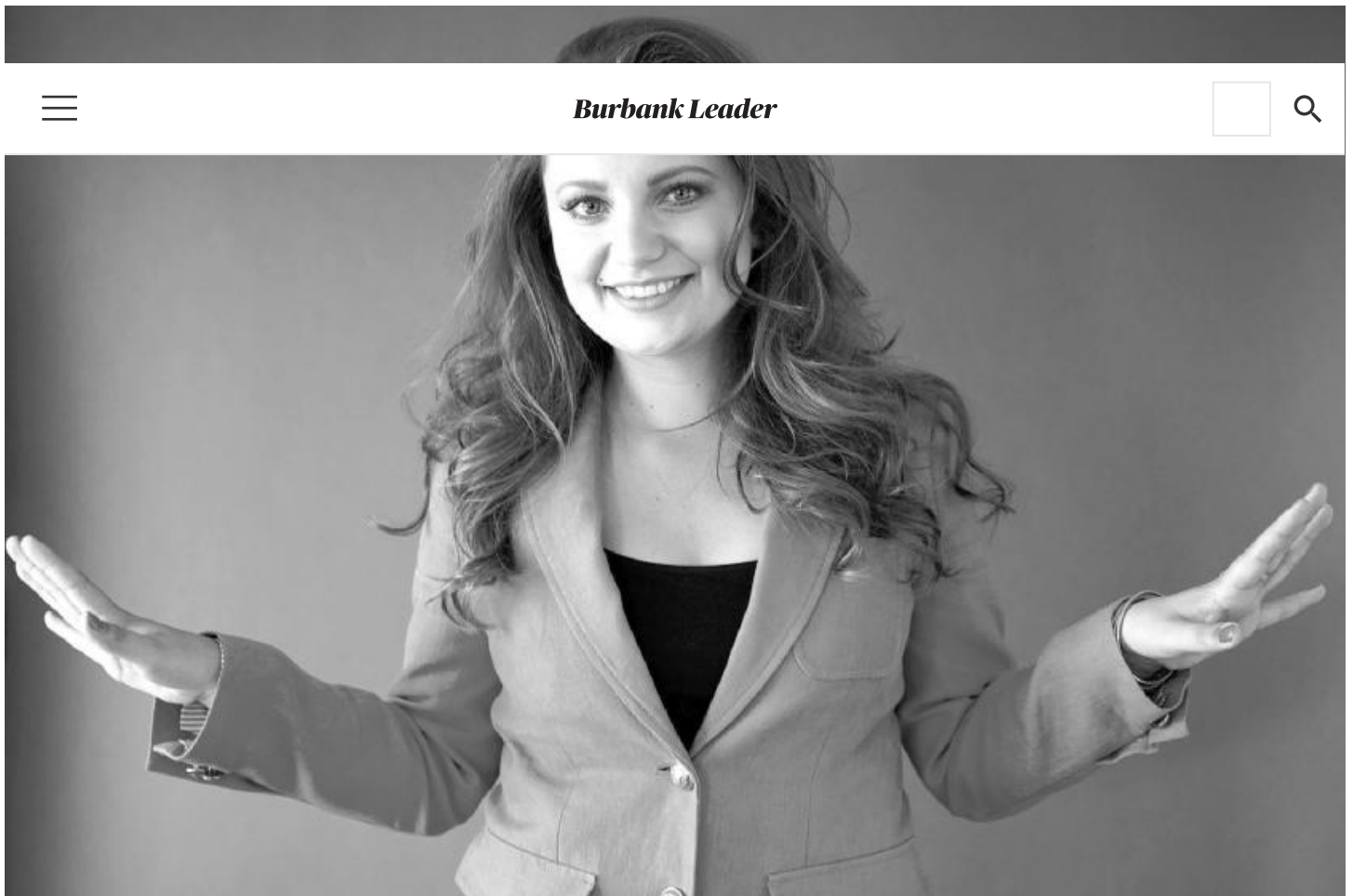

“I’ll be connecting people with their loved ones, people that have passed over or somebody they may want to hear from,” she said. “It’s one of those things that a lot of people wonder if it’s real or not real. So [tonight] is an opportunity for people to come and witness it and experience it for themselves.”

The popularity of audience readings was at its peak more than a decade ago. However, Fleur said that her readings continue to attract many people, including celebrities such as singer Lana Del Rey and Emma Roberts.

“For all of time, there’s been that question of, ‘Is there more?’” she said. “It may not be always available in the media, but [audience readings have] definitely gotten more attention in the media over the last couple of years than it ever has before. As long as people continue to love other people and as long as people continue to pass away, mediumship will have a place.”

Since she was a child, Fleur said that she was able to communicate with the “spirit world,” but was afraid to admit that she had that ability.

When she was a pre-med student at UCLA, Fleur said she started doing readings for people on the side and eventually decided to become a full-time medium.

“Sometimes people think it’s just going to be a night of tears, but there’s some funny elements, too,” she said. “It’s just a really touching evening where you get to hear everybody’s stories and potentially connect to your own loved ones.”
